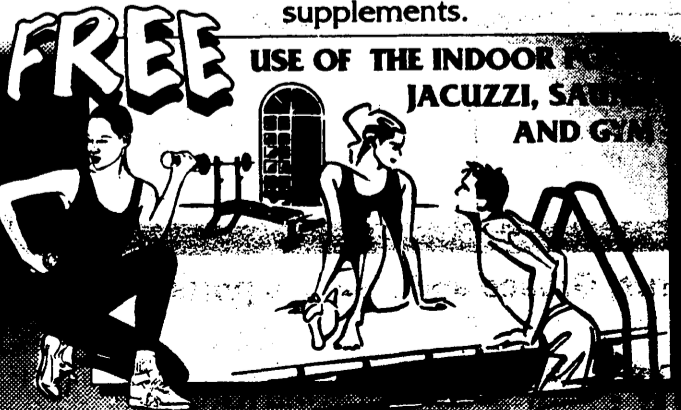

The Bujinkan Brian Dojo is an organization which is responsible for spreading knowledge of the Ninja throughout Europe and it falls under the worldwide Bujinkan banner which is led by the grandmaster Dr Masaaki Hatsumi.

The sad news of the death Angelo E. Debono, more familiarly known as *is-Sur Ang* shocked many of those who knew him.

Apart from the love he had for his birthplace Naxxar, and Floriana where he lived for a good part of his life, *is-Sur Ang* dedicated most of his time to the club he loved so much - Neptunes.

Anglu was an eminent personality. He was endowed with a sense of loyalty and drive to steer the fortunes of the club. He served in many posts on the committee and in 1959 was elected president. He became more steadfastly bent on devoting all his energies to Neptunes. He resigned in 1974 due to health reasons after 15 years of presidency interrupted only in 1964.

A former top employee at Simonds Farsons Cisk Ltd., and a member of the former National Sports Board, *is-Sur Ang* was instrumental in reviving the club from its lean period of the 50s.

In the 60s he laid the ground work for the acquisition by Neptunes of Freddie Portelli from Sirens and later, Alfred Griesti from Bal-luta, two signings that had rocked the waterpolo community.

Through his sheer hard work and with help from other members, the club boasted of a concrete club house which replaced the old wooden hut. The platform was later extended and some time afterwards the club built the first enclosed sea water pool.

Rightly so *is-Sur Ang* was known to be a man for all seasons at Neptunes.

May he enjoy a deserved peaceful rest.
